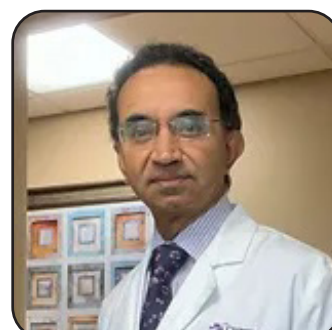

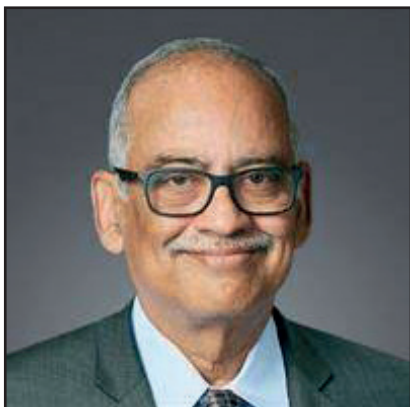

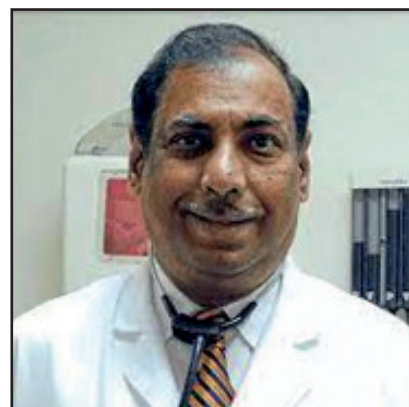

A Courier Boy's tryst with destiny - Celebrating and saluting generous hearts

“ఒరేయ్ వాడి కోసం మనం యేదైనా చేయాలిరా”.

That was my classmate Dr Sridhar referring to a terminally ill classmate of us. But we don't know how to go about helping him. First Sridhar called all our classmate in and outside india and obtained promises for Five lakhs. Then he got the “Royal Rangarayan Society of 1976” Registered, with himself as Secretary, Kurukuri

Venkateswara rao as President and myself as Treasurer. We all met our ailing classmate and promised his family our help. By the time we were able to collect the money he passed away and we have given the money to his family.

That is how the courier boy got his job and never looked back since then. The small seed later grew into a big tree, as our classmates requested us to continue contributing to our College and Hospital. By contributing regularly to our society we were able to donate books and equipment in a big way for almost 20 years. We are able to maintain the momentum of our activities as we used to meet regularly in a different town starting from Bhimavaram

and later Kakinada, Vijayawada, Palakol, Hyderabad, and Visakhapatnam.

Seeing the success of our activities our classmate Lokesh Edara requested us to form the “RMCANA Trust” to carry on activities beyond our college and hospital.

Through this trust we also contributed material to Orphanages, and carried out academic activities like online tests and Lecture competitions to Undergraduates and Post graduates of Five Medical colleges around us.

In the meanwhile the Dr Moturu Bhanu Prasad Memorial Trust was formed with my guru Dr Rao Rangarao a 1960 batch Rangarayan as founder Trustee. I used to help him with the activities of the Trust which was later run by Dr A V Krishnam Raju (1966), Dr Vasantha kumar (1964), and Dr Satyadev (1969) – all distinguished

Rangarayans as Executive Trustees. Upon his retirement Dr Satyadev handed over the Trust to me as Executive Trustee. This Trust is the biggest donor to the college so far and the longest serving body after Ramcosa which is donating books and equipment to the college, Hospital and Library regularly. Thus began the exciting journey in this Trust for me under the able guidance of Dr Prasad Kakarala another distinguished Rangarayan. I have expanded the activities to supporting poor students of the college for their college fees, hostel fees and for books and also donations to orphanages in Kakinada. One of the students supported by this Trust proved worthy of our help and passed out

of our college with flying colours and secured admission in an AIIMS college in Paediatrics. Now this Trust is playing a crucial part in the Maternal and Child Hospital Project of RMCANA by channelling some of the donations through it.

Then Dr Lokesh Edara called me one day and requested me to form another Trust –

The ‘RMCANA India Foundation’ to act as a channel for the activities of RMCANA in India with a broad based basket of activities as their core principles which the other Trusts are lacking. For this body I have chosen Dr Y Kalyan Chakravarthy who is a 1988 Rangarayan and Dr Thejo Krishna a 2001 Rangarayan as Directors along with me. We formed this Foundation in 2022 and is channelling funds for the MCH Project of RMCANA in addition to donating for activities of the Red Cross Society, and Rotary Club of Kakinada.

All these bodies, the Ramcosa, Bhanu Prasad Trust and RMCANA India Foundation have 12A certification (which gives exemption of TDS on their income) and 80G approval from Income Tax department (which gives Tax exemption on donations to these Trusts). We have completed the process of applying for the FCRA (Foreign

Contribution Regulation Act, which allows these bodies to receive funds in foreign currencies) for the RMCANA India Foundation and are awaiting for the approval. We are also initiating the process of applying for the FCRA permission for the Bhanu Prasad Trust.

As I am doing these activities for these bodies, Rangarayans who wanted to donate something to the college used to call me to help find requirements across the college and hospital and help them give something back to it in gratitude.

My journey in the college which continued from my joining in August 1976 till now (except for two years) helped me find the right people who are passionate and departments where there was acute need and connect the donor and recipient for the effective utilization of these donations.

Now I am one of the building committee members for the MCH Project, work on which started in September 2023 and is going on non-stop since then. This project is most crucial to the hospital as it will not only bring a sea change in Maternal and Neonatal services in this part of the state of AP but also will also help the administration to renovate and rebuild the ageing hospital buildings, plans on which were put forward many times but not gone through due to lack of space which the MCH Project will create, as it will have 500+ beds – adding almost 300 beds and freeing the rest in the Gynaec-Paediatric block.

Dear friends, the purpose of writing this piece is not only to bring to your notice the extent of generosity being showered on our parent institutions by grateful and caring alumni but also to celebrate the many individuals and bodies who are making our Alma mater one of the best in academics and patient care.

Be it a Santhi Moturu who donated generously to start the most successful Bhanu Prasad Trust in memory of her late husband.

Be it a Vijay Raghav rao who donated generously to the Golden Jubilee Library project in memory of his parents.

Be it a Kamala Tummala who donated generously to the Department of Cardiology in memory of her late husband Dr Prasad. Be it Paladugu Rambabu who not only donated generously for the MCH Project but also never

leaves an opportunity to raise donations and send equipment to the College and Hospital with unfailing regularity. Be it the 1974, 1976, 1977, 1978, 1980 batches and the Karuturi family, Jagan Kakarala, Nagamani Kilaru, Madhavi Medapati, Rajendra Kakarala, and many generous donors to the MCH Project and others who donated towards the infrastructure and equipment of the college and hospital and contributed towards it's academic excellence.

Or the members of Ramcosa who responded spontaneously to my call for a Digital Blackboard in the Golden Jubilee Library and donated so much that in addition to Golden Jubilee library we also funded the Digital blackboard in the Surgery Examination hall. This started a flood of donations towards donating Digital blackboards which are now present in every major Lecture hall of the college (except the Biochemistry Lecture hall which is presently being renovated) and most of the seminar halls of individual departments, so much so, that our college tops in the number of Digital blackboards among the Medical colleges of the state of AP.

I will be failing in my duty if I don't mention Lokesh Edara who breathes, sleeps, lives and loves and strives for improvement and transformation in academics, not just in our college but all over India.

And Vishnu Kalidindi who is passionate about academics and conducts CMEs with credit hours during our Reunions and the prime motivator of the MCH Project.

And AV Subbaraya Chowdary the fervent, ardent and Obsessive force behind the MCH Project.

And SSC Chakra Rao who created history by promoting CPR across the country. He created

a virtual tsunami of CPR training across the country and brought so much awareness that nowadays we find references to CPR in movies and TV serials. He made the Indian Council of Resuscitation Federation a member of the prestigious ILCOR and is justly one of the Chief Guests of the present RMCANA Biennial Reunion.

And DSVL Narasimham the present Principal, Director of Medical Education and Vice Chancellor of Dr NTR University of Health sciences who galvanized the students with his many initiatives. Among his crowning achievements is the 'Rangaraya Newsletter' which is into it's second year of regular publication and is one of a kind in the entire country among medical colleges and now the RMC Global Journal.

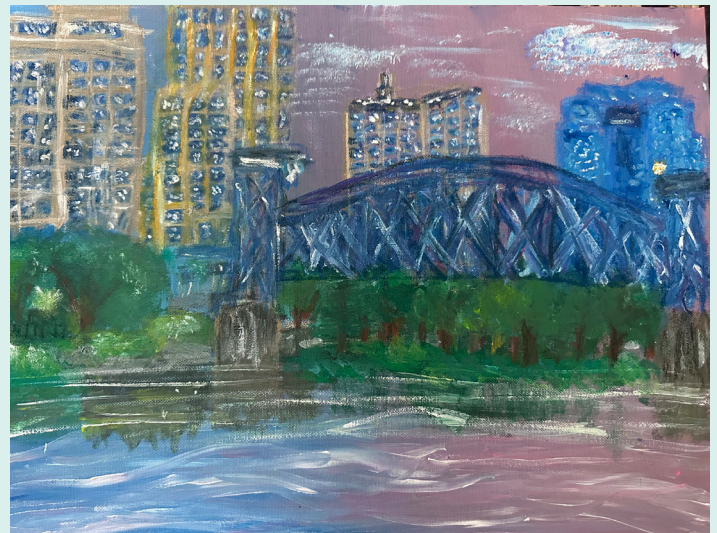

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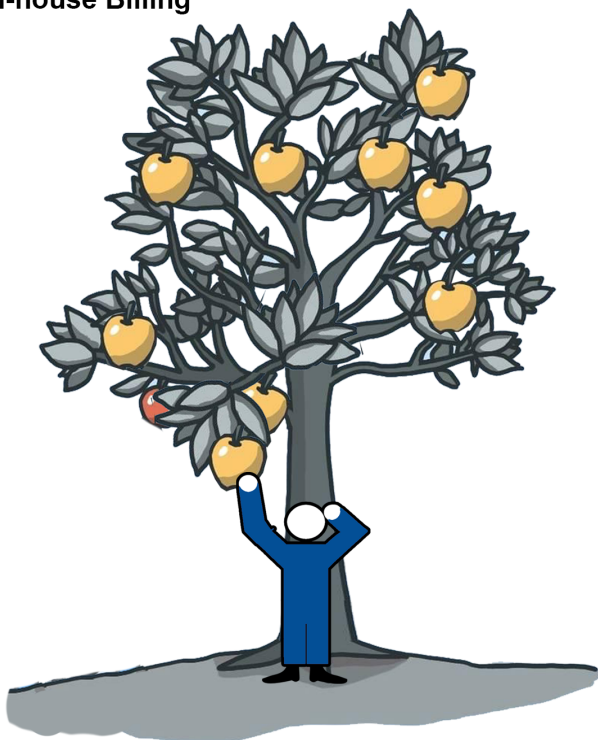

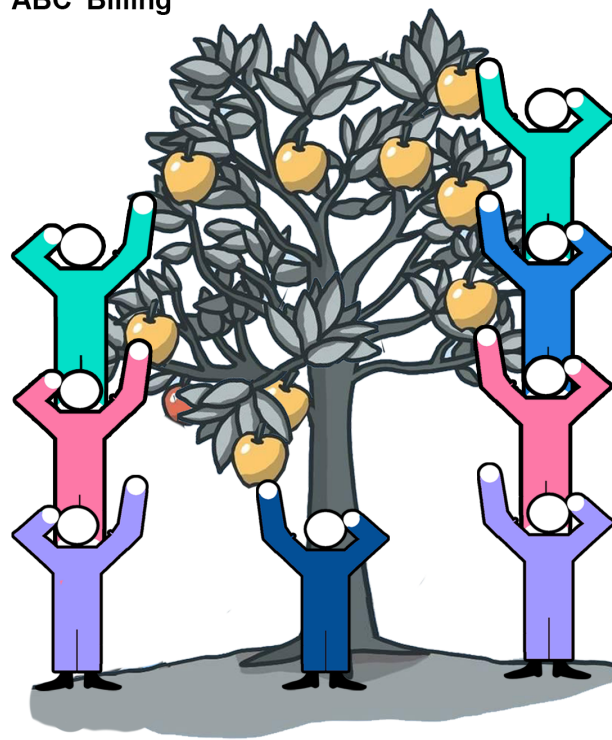
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
